

## Luncheon is all about the future

It will be a battle of the 'burbs at the next Property Council of Australia Gold Coast luncheon on Friday.

Independent property analyst Colleen Coyne, director of Colleen Coyne Property Research, will look at which Gold Coast and Tweed sub-regions are best positioned to cope with the predicted high level of population growth over the next 25 years.

She also will discuss drivers of job creation in 10 economic sub-regions and pinpoint the areas set to provide the greatest job creation in coming years.

Andrew Batts, an associate of global firm ARUP, will speak about transit-oriented developments and the role they might play in creating more sustainable communities in the Gold Coast-Tweed region.
